



POLICY: P-REG-101 TITLE: GRADUATE ADMISSIONS CRITERIA POLICY

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This document outlines the admission requirements for postgraduate degree programs at the Mohammed Bin Rashid School of Government (MRBSG). Approval of MBRSG entry requirements is vested in the Board of Trustees. The overall responsibility of applying these requirements and implementing the admission process lies with the Admissions and Registration Section in consultation with the Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee as appointed by the Dean). This policy complies with the requirements of the Ministry of Education (MOE):

- 1.1 2019 Standards for Institutional Licensure and Program Accreditation, Stipulation 6 (Students) and Stipulation 6.3 (Graduate Admission).
- 1.2 Resolution of the Minister of Education, Article 133, 2005.
- 1.3 Resolution of the Minister of Education, Article 200, 2004.

3.0 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS - DOCUMENTATION

- 3.1 Candidates wishing to apply for graduate programs of study at MBRSG must submit (in hard copy and/or online in digital format) the following documents:
 - Completion of the online Graduate Study Application Form available on the Student Information System accessible via the Academic Program link from the MBRSG website.
 - Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a





minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 (on a 4.0 Scale) for full admission or 2.50 (on a 4.0 Scale) for Conditional Admission.

- Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
- Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s)
 document issued for EmSAT or TOEFL or Academic IELTS scores as
 required to satisfy the English language proficiency requirement,
 relevant to the graduate program of study:
 - Full Admission: Master Program taught in English: Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (1400 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 550 or more (213 CBT, 79 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (6.0 or more) OR
 - Conditional Admission: Master Program taught in English:
 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for an (i) EmSAT score of a minimum of 1250, OR (ii) a TOEFL score of 530 or more (197 CBT, 71 iBT) equivalent OR an IELTS (Academic) score of a minimum of 5.5.
 - Full Admission: Master Program taught in Arabic:
 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (950 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 450 or more (133 CBT, 45 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (4.5 or more).
- For a <u>Master Program taught in Arabic</u>: A candidate must satisfy the Arabic language proficiency requirement as follows:
 - Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for a (i) Minimum score of 1250 for the Arabic language portion of the EmSAT examination.
- Provision of a Passport copy (personal details page, Ethbara Number page and/or visa page (if applicable))
- Provision of two passport-size photos.
- Provision of an Emirates ID card (if relevant)
- Provision of a Family Book (if relevant)
- Provision of their Curriculum Vitae
- Provision of a short essay to demonstrate your reasons for wanting to study in the program
- Provision of two individual, sealed reference letters.
- Confirmation that the work experience requirement, specific to the graduate program of study, has been satisfied.
- An interview may also be required as part of the admission process.





3.2 Academic Certificates and Transcripts Authentication

- 3.2.1 In order to process an application for Admission to a Graduate program of study at MBRSG, the original documents noted at Section 3.1 above need to be provided to the Admissions and Registration Section at MBRSG.
- 3.2.2 A member of the Admissions and Registration Section will copy and return the original documents to the applicant and then stamp and date the copies as 'Original Sighted and Returned'.
- 3.2.3 The original sighted documents will be placed on the student file (in hard copy) or digitally (online) in the Student Management System).

3.3 <u>Decisions on Admission to a Graduate program of study at the Mohammed</u> Bin Rashid School of Government

3.3.1 The Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee appointed by the Dean) may use their discretion to admit a student to a graduate program of study at MBRSG. Such discretion must be clearly documented on the student file (hard copy file or digital (online file) and be in accordance with the Commission for Academic Accreditation (CAA) Standards (i.e. CAA Standards 2019, Section 6.3 Graduate Admission).

4.0 POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK ENTRY REQUIREMENTS – FULL ADMISSION

- 4.1 General admission requirements for a Master Degree Program (Master of Public Administration (MPA), Master of Innovation Management (MIM) or Master of Public Policy (MPP) including concentrations therein) taught in the English Language: FULL ADMISSION:
 - 4.1.1 Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 (on a 4.0 Scale).
 - 4.1.2 Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for recognized degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
 - 4.1.3 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (1400 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score

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of 550 or more (213 CBT, 79 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (6.0 or more) to satisfy the English language proficiency condition.

- 4.1.3.1 Students who have completed undergraduate education in an English-medium institution might be allowed admission into a graduate program without demonstrating TOEFL score of 550 (or equivalent). This exemption can be applicable only to those students who undertook all their schooling (K-12) plus a Bachelor's degree in English in a reference/native English speaking country (e.g. UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand).
- **4.2** Students granted full admission will also be required to take the (ASM001) "Foundation Course for Research Methods in Public Policy" during their first semester of academic study. It is a not for credit Module but will appear on the student's academic transcript.
- 5.0 General admission requirements for an Executive Master degree program

 (Executive Master of Public Administration) taught in the Arabic

 Language: FULL ADMISSION:
 - 5.1.1 Applicants applying to an *Executive Master* degree program taught in the Arabic language, must meet the following entry requirements for full admission. Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 (on a 4.0 Scale).
 - 5.1.2 Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
 - 5.1.3 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (950 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 450 or more (133 CBT, 45 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (4.5 or more) to satisfy the English language proficiency condition.
 - 5.1.4 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for a (i) Minimum score of 1250 for the Arabic language portion of





- the EmSAT examination to satisfy the Arabic language proficiency condition.
- 5.1.5 A minimum of five (5) years of documented professional work experience (gained prior to admission).
- 5.2 Students granted full admission will also be required to take the (ASM001) "Foundation Course for Research Methods in Public Policy" during their first semester of academic study. It is a not for credit Module but will appear on the student's academic transcript.
- 6.0 POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK ENTRY REQUIREMENTS CONDITIONAL ADMISSION: ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMS
 - 6.1 General admission requirements for a Master Degree Program (Master of Public Administration (MPA), Master of Innovation Management (MIM) or Master of Public Policy (MPP) including concentrations therein) taught in the English Language: CONDITIONAL ADMISSION English Language Proficiency
 - 6.1.1 Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 (on a 4.0 Scale).
 - **6.1.2** Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
 - 6.1.3 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for an (i) EmSAT score of a minimum of 1250, OR (ii) a TOEFL score of 530 or more (197 CBT, 71 iBT) equivalent OR an IELTS (Academic) score of a minimum of 5.5.
 - 6.2 <u>General admission requirements for a Master Degree Program (Master of Public Administration (MPA), Master of Innovation Management (MIM) or Master of Public Policy (MPP) including concentrations therein) taught in the English Language: CONDITIONAL ADMISSION Grade Point Average</u>
 - **6.2.1** Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 (on a 4.0 Scale).





- **6.2.2** Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
- **6.2.3** Provision of an original and Official standardized test score (s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (1400 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 550 or more (213 CBT, 79 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (6.0 or more) to satisfy the English language proficiency condition.
 - 6.2.3.1 Students who have completed undergraduate education in an English-medium institution might be allowed admission into a graduate program without demonstrating TOEFL score of 550 (or equivalent). This exemption can be applicable only to those students who undertook all their schooling (K-12) plus a Bachelor's degree in English in a reference/native English speaking country (e.g. UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand).

6.3 Conditional Admission Requirements – Other

6.3.1 The Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee appointed by the Dean) may use their discretion to admit a student to a graduate program of study at MBRSG under a conditional admission status. Such discretion must be clearly documented on the student file (hard copy file or digital (online file) and be in accordance with the Commission for Academic Accreditation (CAA) Standards (i.e. CAA Standards 2019, Section 6.3 Graduate Admission).

6.4 Conditional Admission: Additional Requirements

- 6.4.1 Students applying for conditional entry admission may also be interviewed by the Program Coordinator of their intended degree program and/or the Director of Academic Affairs. They will then provide an explanation of their reasons for recommending or not recommending an applicant to be admitted. The recommendation will be kept on the student admission file.
- **6.4.2** Students granted conditional admission will also be required to take the (ASM001) "Foundation Course for Research Methods in Public Policy" during their first semester of academic study. It is a not for credit Module but will appear on the student's academic transcript.





6.5 Conditional Admission: Enrolment Restrictions

- **6.5.1** Students admitted on conditional basis to a graduate program of study will normally be limited to studying two (2) Modules (20 CATS credits each) of coursework, thus a total of 40 CATS Credits, in the first semester of study.
- 6.5.2 In extraordinary circumstances, at the discretion of and upon approval by the Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee appointed by the Dean), a conditionally admitted student may study three (3) Modules (20 CATS credits each) of coursework, thus a total of 60 CATS Credits, in the first semester of study. This is in accordance with provision 6.3.8 of the Standards 2019.

6.6 Satisfying Conditional Admission Requirements – Timeframe

- 6.6.1 The progress of students granted Conditional Admission will be monitored by the Director of Academic Affairs (Chair of the Progression Board), who will lead a review of the performance of each conditional entry student as part of Progression Board Meetings held at the end of each semester.
- 6.6.2 Students granted conditional admission under the English Language Proficiency provisions must achieve a <u>minimum</u> (i) EmSAT score of 1400, or (ii)TOEFL score of 550 or more (213 CBT, 79 iBT equivalent) or (iii) 6.0 on the IELTS test, <u>prior to the commencement of their second semester of study.</u> This must be verified by submitting the original Test Certificate prior to the commencement of their second semester of enrolment.
- 6.6.3 Students granted Conditional Admission must also achieve an overall average grade of at least "Pass with Merit" to continue into their second semester of study. Upon achievement of the English language Proficiency and Overall Average Grade provisions, the student's admission status will no longer be considered as conditional. If the student does not obtain the minimum average grade of at least "Pass with Merit", he or she may be dismissed from the program.
- **6.6.4** The Chair of the Progression Board may use their discretion to determine whether conditionally admitted students, who achieve an overall average grade within three (3) marks, of a cumulative overall average grade of "Pass with Merit" can continue in the





program. If such a decision is made the student will be subject to academic probation.

- 6.6.5 Failure to meet the English Language Proficiency and Overall Average Grade requirements (Pass with Merit) criteria by the end of the first semester of study will lead to the student, either:
 - **6.6.5.1** Having to defer for the following semester (in order to meet the English proficiency requirement) OR
 - 6.6.5.2 Upon the decision of the discretion of the Chair of the Progression Board, who achieve a grade "Pass" or "Pass with Credit" but do not achieve a grade "Pass with Merit" (subject to Section 4.5.4. above) may be given the opportunity to repeat the Module(s) (once) to attain the overall average grade of "Pass with Merit" OR
 - **6.6.5.3** Having to withdraw from the program or study
 - Having to seek special consideration and approval from the Director of Academic Affairs, or the Dean, for an extension in which to satisfy the conditional admission requirement(s) due to unforeseen or extraordinary circumstances.
 - 6.6.5.5 The Registrar's Office will notify students, in writing (in Letter or e-mail format), at the end of the first semester of study of their admission status. This will occur within seven (7) days of official grades being released by the Examination Board and of decisions made by the Progression Board. Student file records will be updated to reflect the decision.

6.7 Orientation – New Students

6.7.1 In support of students at the commencement of their graduate studies or at what may be a return to an academic environment after a period away from higher education, MBRSG requires that all new students admitted to a graduate program attend the Orientation Session. The Orientation session will be delivered prior to the commencement of the first semester of study.

7.0 POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK ENTRY REQUIREMENTS – CONDITIONAL ADMISSION: ARABIC LANGUAGE PROGRAMS





- 7.1 <u>General admission requirements for an Executive Master degree</u>
 program (Executive Master of Public Administration)) taught in the Arabic
 Language:CONDITIONAL ADMISSION —Grade Point Average, English and
 Arabic Language Proficiency.
 - 7.1.1 Provision of attested official university and college degrees and transcripts, from a recognized Bachelor's degree, earned in a discipline appropriate for the prospective graduate degree, with a minimum (equivalent) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.50 (on a 4.0 Scale).
 - **7.1.2** Provision of an equivalence certificate from the Ministry of Education in the United Arab Emirates for degrees completed outside the United Arab Emirates.
 - 7.1.3 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score (s) document issued for (i) EmSAT (950 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 450 or more (133 CBT, 45 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (4.5 or more) to satisfy the English language proficiency condition.
 - 7.1.4 Provision of an original and Official standardized test score(s) document issued for a (i) Minimum score of 1250 for the Arabic language portion of the EmSAT examination to satisfy the Arabic language proficiency condition.
 - **7.1.5** A minimum of five (5) years of documented professional work experience (gained prior to admission).

7.2 Conditional Admission Requirements – Other

7.2.1 The Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee appointed by the Dean) may use their discretion to admit a student to a graduate program of study at MBRSG under a conditional admission status. Such discretion must be clearly documented on the student file (hard copy file or digital (online file) and be and be in accordance with the Commission for Academic Accreditation (CAA) Standards (i.e. CAA Standards 2019, Section 6.3 Graduate Admission).

7.3 Conditional Admission: Additional Requirements





- 7.3.1 Students applying for conditional entry admission may also be interviewed by the Program Coordinator of their intended degree program and/or the Director of Academic Affairs. They will then provide an explanation of their reasons for recommending or not recommending an applicant to be admitted. The recommendation will be kept on the student admission file.
- 7.3.2 Students granted conditional admission will also be required to take the (ASM001) "Foundation Course for Research Methods in Public Policy" during their first semester of academic study. It is a not for credit Module but will appear on the student's academic transcript.

7.4 Conditional Admission: Enrolment Restrictions

- **7.4.1** Students admitted on conditional basis to a graduate program of study will normally be limited to studying two (2) Modules (20 CATS credits each) of coursework, thus a total of 40 CATS Credits, in the first semester of study.
- 7.4.2 In extraordinary circumstances, at the discretion of and upon approval by the Director of Academic Affairs (or nominee appointed by the Dean), a conditionally admitted student may study three (3) Modules (20 CATS credits each) of coursework, thus a total of 60 CATS Credits, in the first semester of study. This is in accordance with provision 6.3.8 of the Standards 2019.

7.5 Satisfying Conditional Admission Requirements – Timeframe

- 7.5.1 The progress of students granted Conditional Admission will be monitored by the Director of Academic Affairs (Chair of the Progression Board), who will lead a review of the performance of each conditional entry student as part of Progression Board Meetings held at the end of each semester.
- 7.5.2 Students granted conditional admission under the English Language Proficiency provisions must achieve a <u>minimum</u> (i) EmSAT (950 or more) or (ii) a TOEFL score of 450 or more (133 CBT, 45 iBT) equivalent or IELTS (4.5 or more) to satisfy the English language proficiency condition, <u>prior to the commencement of their second semester of study.</u> This must be verified by submitting the original Test Certificate prior to the commencement of their second semester of enrolment.
- **7.5.3** Students granted conditional admission under the Arabic Language Proficiency provisions must achieve a <u>minimum</u> score of 1250 for the Arabic language portion of the EmSAT examination to





- satisfy the Arabic language proficiency condition, <u>prior to the</u> <u>commencement of their second semester of study.</u> This must be verified by submitting the original Test Certificate prior to the commencement of their second semester of enrolment.
- 7.5.4 Students granted Conditional Admission must also achieve an overall average grade of at least "Pass with Merit" to continue into their second semester of study. Upon achievement of the English and Arabic Language Proficiency and Overall Average Grade provisions, the student's admission status will no longer be considered as conditional. If the student does not obtain the minimum average grade of at least "Pass with Merit", he or she may be dismissed from the program.
- 7.5.5 The Chair of the Progression Board may use their discretion to determine whether conditionally admitted students, who achieve an overall average grade within three (3) marks, of a cumulative overall average grade of "Pass with Merit" can continue in the program. If such a decision is made the student will be subject to academic probation.
- **7.5.6** Failure to meet the English and Arabic Language Proficiency and Overall Average Grade requirements (Pass with Merit) criteria by the end of the first semester of study will lead to the student, either:
 - 7.5.6.1 Having to defer for the following semester (in order to meet the English and/or Arabic language proficiency requirement(s)) OR
 - 7.5.6.2 Upon the decision of the discretion of the Chair of the Progression Board, who achieve a grade "Pass" or "Pass with Credit" but do not achieve a grade "Pass with Merit" (subject to Section 5.5.4. above) may be given the opportunity to repeat the Module(s) (once) to attain the overall average grade of "Pass with Merit" OR
 - **7.5.6.3** Having to withdraw from the program or study
 - 7.5.6.4 Having to seek special consideration and approval from the Director of Academic Affairs, or the Dean, for an extension in which to satisfy the conditional admission requirement(s) due to unforeseen or extraordinary circumstances.
 - 7.5.6.5 The Registrar's Office will notify students, in writing (in Letter or e-mail format), at the end of the first semester of study of their admission status. This will occur within seven (7) days of official grades being released by the Examination Board and of decisions made by the





Progression Board. Student file records will be updated to reflect the decision.

7.6 Orientation - New Students

7.6.1 In support of students at the commencement of their graduate studies or at what may be a return to an academic environment after a period away from higher education, MBRSG requires that all new students admitted to a graduate program attend the Orientation Session. The Orientation session will be delivered prior to the commencement of the first semester of study.

8.0 TRANSFER ADMISSION

- 8.1.1 Students, who have studied, in a graduate program of study outside of MBRSG, cannot apply for Transfer Admission. That is, applicants will not have credit achieved in a graduate program of study at another Higher Education Institution, be transferred or counted towards credit for a Module in an MBRSG Graduate Program of study.
- **8.1.2** Students who have studied and achieved module credits in a graduate program of study within MBRSG may be eligible for Transfer Admission as per the Transfer of Credit provisions noted in this policy and as detailed in the Graduate Re-Admissions Criteria Policy (P-REG-102).

9.0 RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

9.1.1 In accordance with the Transfer Admissions provisions above, MBRSG does not allow students, who have studied in a graduate program of study outside of MBRSG, to receive credits in Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for a graduate program of study at MBRSG.

10.0 TRANSFER OF CREDIT

10.1.1 Only Students who have studied and achieved module credits in a graduate program of study at MBRSG, may be eligible to Transfer Credits previously earned, upon (re) admission to a graduate program of study at MBRSG.





- **10.1.2** The provisions for such transfer of Credit provision are detailed in the Graduate Re-Admissions Criteria Policy (P-REG-102).
- **10.1.3** Credit transfer will be determined and approved by the Director of Academic Affairs (or other nominee as appointed by the Dean).
- **10.1.4** Credit transfer Upon Re-Admission at MBRSG is only available:
 - 10.1.4.1 For those modules successfully completed where they are still part of the current graduate program being applied to; and
 - 10.1.4.2 Only those Module(s) with a minimum cumulative overall average grade of Pass with Merit or GPA (B Grade) equivalent may transfer credit be awarded for.
 - 10.1.4.3 No more than three (3) Pass or Pass with Credit Module (s) (maximum of 60 CATS Credits) may be awarded for credit transfer purposes between graduate programs of study at MBRSG as per the Table below:

- **10.1.4.4** Can only be approved for a student whose first registration at this School was not more than eight years from the date of readmission.
- 10.1.5 Students who have exited an MBRSG program of study with a Postgraduate Diploma will not be readmitted to the Master Program, to which the Exit Award of a Postgraduate Diploma was conferred. In such cases no transfer of credits will be applicable.
- **10.1.6** Any claims or appeals for approval of credit transfer that are not covered by the provisions of this policy will be referred to the Chair of the Board of Studies for their determination.
